Neighbors against Drugs

On April 7, 2005, Mayor Schmitt and members of the Mayor's Neighborhood Leadership Council met and discussed a new program the Police Department is eager to implement. The program, Neighbors Against Drugs, targets suspected drug houses by conducting surveys to document suspected drug activity and distributing anti-drug lawn signs to neighboring houses. The goal is to identify, isolate, and put pressure on suspected drug dealers to leave the neighborhood or on landlords to force them out. This is done through the threat of civil, rather than criminal, action. The MNLC unanimously voted to implement the program. The Police Department is seeking volunteers to assist with the program; anyone interested is asked to contact Cheryl Renier-Wigg at 448-3412.

Gypsy Moth "To Do" List

MAY–JUNE: Apply biological or chemical insecticides at this time. The most common treatment used against gypsy moth is a spray of *Bacillus thuringiensis*, commonly called Bt. This bacterial insecticide kills younger (less than ½ inch long) caterpillars that eat before it naturally degrades within a week; it does not affect other animals. Numerous chemical insecticides can be found; check the label to ensure that gypsy moths are listed. Acephate, carbaryl, and malathion are the most common active ingredients. A Message from the Green Bay Fire Department

Mike Link is a Lieutenant with the Green Bay Fire Department. He works in the Fire Prevention and Public Education Department, and one of his duties is to provide fire safety education to businesses and residents in the community of Green Bay. This includes speaking at staff meetings, classroom settings, and in-home education.

Another service he provides is courtesy Home Safety Inspections, which includes providing information and education about the installation and maintenance of smoke and carbon monoxide alarms; fire extinguisher training; evacuation plans; smoking safety; space heater safety; fireplace safety; furnace and water heater safety and maintenance; candle safety; matches and lighter safety and storage; cooking and kitchen safety; outdoor cooking safety; electrical safety; and general home fire safety and injury prevention.
